

Orange Junior Soccer Club 2009-10 All Star Selection Process

1. All Stars is a competitive tournament. OJSC's goal is to create a positive tournament experience for our All Star players. To this end, OJSC intends to select the most physically capable and sportsmanlike athletes to represent the club.
 2. The first place head coach in good standing is given first option to coach the All Star team.
 3. If the first place head coach declines, the second place head coach in good standing with OJSC is given the option, and so on. The coach must hold a minimum of a Cal South YM-3 coaching license to even be considered.
 4. The All Star head coach may select his/her assistant coaches in good standing with OJSC.
 5. The top rated players in good standing from each team will receive an invitation from the Board to attend All Star tryouts. The amount from each team will vary depending on the amount of teams in that division. This number will be set year to year
 6. Thereafter, any remaining age-appropriate players in good standing and that believe they are of All Star caliber will be welcome to attend the All Star tryouts. (Coach's recommendation will be helpful in this regard).
- NOTE: If a player, played up in age, in a division during the Fall Recreation season. That player will be welcome to walk on to their actual league age division try out.**
7. There will be two All Star tryout dates. Invited players and walk on players are expected to attend both dates. A no show is considered a non-interest. Try out dates will be announced at the Annual General Meeting in November and then published via the "Goal Post."
 8. Recreation, Signature and Premier coaches in the applicable division will be invited to observe tryouts.
 9. Premier coaches will conduct tryouts. The All Star head coach will be in partnership with the Premier coaches regarding the tryout activities so that he/she is free to observe without the responsibility of administering the tryout.
 10. At the first tryout, players will be asked to confirm their availability to fully participate in training sessions and games. If a player is unavailable for either training or games, the player will be removed from the All Star candidate pool and excused from the second tryout.
 11. Based on the first and second tryout and observations over the Fall Recreation season, a draft roster including no more than 4 substitutes and 2 alternates, will be submitted by the All Star head coach to the Vice President of Inter League Competition (VPILC).
 12. The roster will be drafted by the All Star head coach, Premier Program Director, Vice President of Fall and VPILC (or their designee). Again, the goal is to select the most physically capable and sportsmanlike athletes to represent OJSC so other input, particularly from those with first-hand observations of the season (Fall Recreation head coach) and tryouts, should be solicited as necessary.
 13. The VPILC will confirm the availability of the players on the draft roster. If a player on the draft roster is unavailable, the first alternate will be contacted, and so on.
 14. Once the VPILC has confirmed the availability of a full roster, the roster will be presented via e-mail to the OJSC Board for the Board's information.
 15. All players, coaches and parents must fully understand that no one player is guaranteed to make the All Star team. This process is a try out to select the best possible Recreation All Star team that OJSC can field. No Fall season Signature players will be allowed to try out for the All Star team.
